I'm Terry Davis, general manager of Cameco's Blind River Refinery since 2020, and our goal is to share more information about our operations and activities.


At the heart of everything we do is a strong commitment to the

At Cameco, we're proud of our role in powering a secure energy future. In Ontario, nuclear energy accounts for approximately **60% of the clean-air electricity** that is powering our homes and businesses. We play an important role in nuclear industries both here in Canada and around the world.

What do we do at Blind River Refinery?

Cameco's Blind River Refinery (Refinery) opened in 1983 and remains the world's largest uranium refinery.

The plant processes uranium concentrates from mines around the world including Canada, the US and Australia to produce a high-purity uranium trioxide (UO₃) powder. This product is then shipped to Cameco's Port Hope Conversion Facility for further processing where it can be converted to either uranium dioxide (UO₂) and fabricated into fuel bundles for CANDU heavy water reactors or to uranium hexafluoride (UF2) which is sent internationally to enrichment facilities for use in light water reactors.

The Refinery employs approximately 170 workers and operates under a licence granted by the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC), which regulates Canada's nuclear industry. The Refinery's current licence is valid until 2032, when Cameco will apply for a renewal.

The facility includes a processing plant, water treatment plant, power plant and analytical labs and operates 7 days a week, 24 hours a day except during annual maintenance shutdowns. The Blind River Refinery is in full compliance with all CNSC regulatory requirements.



Safety is Cameco's top priority, and we are guided everyday by our commitment to safeguarding the health and safety of our people, communities and the environment.

Through our work right here in Blind River, we are supporting the production of nuclear energy around the world – helping to reduce carbon emissions, fight climate change, and power a cleaner, more secure energy future.

Our 20th annual Cameco Cares Day

On June 5, Blind River Refinery employees participated in the 20th annual Cameco Cares Day.

Together, 60 employees divided into 14 teams completed 23 jobs across the Town of Blind River, Mississauga First Nation, Township of the North Shore and the Municipality of Huron Shores.

Cameco Cares Day was established in 2005 as a way for Cameco employees to give back to the community. What began as a day to assist seniors has expanded to work being completed in a range of public spaces that can be enjoyed by all. Not only is there strong participation from workers, but the day has also grown into a much-loved community event, inspiring project requests from municipalities, schools,

and local organizations.

This year's projects included painting a basketball court at the outdoor rink, constructing picnic tables, replacing gazebo benches and railings, raking beaches, trimming hedges, creating a fire pit, and more.


Since its inception in 2022, the tournament has raised \$73,000 for mental health!
